Weekday Masses During Lent: As well as 10.00am Mass (and 7.00pm most Thursdays) in St. Conval's, there will be Mass in St. Benedict's High School at 8.25am on Mondays and Wednesdays as well as the usual Friday 12.25pm Mass. All are welcome to the school to attend these Masses.

The Legion Of Mary are praying the Rosary in Kilbarchan Cemetery on Mother's Day on Sunday, 26th March 2017 at 1.30pm. All are very welcome.

Lenten Scriptures: Fr Michael's talks will continue on Thursday, 6th April 2017 at 7.30pm. All welcome to the hall for this exciting session!

Giving Tree And Prayer Tree: To offer a focus for this Lent - a time of prayer, fasting and almsgiving - of sacrifice and repentance and generosity to our neighbour. You will see two trees on the Sanctuary: one is our Giving Tree hung with many labels. Please take a label and bring the item named on the label to the Church and place it under the tree. All these items are suitable for and will be given to the homeless and poor. There is no need to wrap or package them. The other is our Prayer Tree, it's bare at the moment, but there are labels beside it for you to take and complete with a prayer intention, which you can then hang on the tree. We will pray each day of Lent for these intentions. As Lent progresses therefore, one tree will empty of its 'leaves' (the Giving Tree) and one will flourish with 'leaves' (our Prayer Tree). The gifts need not be expensive, just the product of what we save through fasting, and the prayers need not be too personal – though they will not be read out!

Collection Envelopes: As is the custom in all parishes at our Offertory collection we have envelopes which enable us through the Gift Aid Scheme to reclaim the tax on all contributions made to the Church. You do not need a collection envelope in order to contribute! If you are a tax payer (even if you only pay a little tax) PLEASE sign a Gift Aid Declaration and the parish can claim back 25p of every £1.00 you contribute at no extra cost to you. This does not require you to divulge any personal information about your income or tax arrangements and Fr. Michael will be the only one who knows which envelope is yours. HMRC require him to keep this record and it is kept in the strictest confidence. Last year they sent us £4,832.00 – a substantial contribution – for the upkeep of the parish. The box of envelopes will contain green envelopes for the first collections and pink envelopes for the special second collections allowing the parish to reclaim tax on these Gift Aid contributions.

Any parishioners who would like to use Gift Aid envelopes and those parishioners who currently use them can uplift their box of envelopes for 2017-2018 from the meeting room after the Saturday Vigil Mass or after the Sunday Morning Mass during the weekends of 25th / 26th March and 1st / 2nd April 2017.

Thank You: There is a letter in the porch from Fr. Michael thanking parishioners for their generous financial support of our Parish. It provides a summary of account for the year 2016 with a few notes regarding the finances of the Parish. Please take a copy home with you.

Hall Update: We received our furniture for the new hall this week. Seamill Hydro were replacing their banqueting suite furnishings and we were able to obtain – at a very good price – the furniture they were selling on. Fr. Michael is still trying to obtain the certificate of completion from the Planning Department of Renfrewshire Council. The issue is a minor technicality but, as is often the case in these matters, it must be in order before certification can be obtained.
